- Current Research Work
 - Paid graduate research assistant for Douglas Bruce, PhD, MSW at DePaul University. Currently working on two research projects. (January 2016 – Present)
 - 1. Patient-provider communication on cannabis.

- This study focuses on the interactions – or lack of interactions – between patients and medical providers when discussing or attempting to obtain medical cannabis for a chronic condition.
 - My work has entailed literature reviews, literature summaries, IRB proposal and edits, data collection from semi-structured interviews of ~20 participants about 1 hr. in length each, and content data analysis. Data has been fully collected.
- Currently preparing a manuscript on “Self-efficacy in the process of researching, obtaining, and using cannabis for symptom management of chronic conditions,” where I will be the primary author, but also assisting with two other manuscripts surrounding cannabis usage to reduce opioid consumption and to assist in daily activities such as chores.
- 2. Motivations for cannabis use among young men who have sex with men living with HIV/AIDS (YMSMLHIV)
 - This mixed methods study is just beginning, but will investigate the range of motives (recreational, therapeutic or medical, and stress-related) associated with heavy cannabis use among YMSMLHIV through semi-structured interviews and questionnaires.
 - This project is in collaboration with the University of Colorado Denver. I visited the University in November to instruct graduate students in interview protocol and technique for the semi-structured interviews.
- Graduate research assistant in the Healthy Families Lab run by Jocelyn Smith Carter, PhD at DePaul University. The lab focuses on community-based research on health habits in children and families. (August 2015 – Present)
 - Currently working on two projects that promote healthy habits among kids. The majority of the kids in the programs are recruited through the DePaul Family and Community Services clinic, which primarily focuses on children with diagnosed mental disorders and their families that may not have access to quality behavioral health services.
 - 1. MOVE program. This program focuses on fun exercises and workouts that incorporate a range of physical skills. Frequency of classes varied depending on the quarter. (January 2016 – Present)
 - 2. Cooking Classes. This program taught new, healthy, and fun recipes to both kids and their families. The recipes would be cooked during the class and the participants were sent home with the ingredients to make it in the future. Initially an instructor was brought in to teach the classes with myself and

others assisting, but for Fall quarter 2016 I suggested we switch to teach the classes ourselves. (January 2016 – Present)

- Working with Jennifer Zimmerman, PhD on my Master's thesis. Proposal accepted 11/22/16, defense estimated April 2017. (April 2016 – Present)
 - The effects of perceived safety, perceived wellness, fear of heterosexism, and identity internalization on public displays of affection among gender and sexual minorities (GSM).
 - Public displays of affection among couples can elicit emotional reactions from observers. Because they are a highly stigmatized group, GSM remain frequent targets of harassment, violence, and discrimination. Thus, GSM PDA not only reveals the couple to be gender or sexual minorities, but also links them to an action that has a negative connotation.
 - Work has included literature review, thesis drafting, measure development and revision, and thesis proposal.
