Primary duties include provision of direct assessment and intervention services for children and their families, with a focus on ASD (e.g., differential diagnosis, team-based assessment, behavioral therapy, parent training). Reliable administration of the ADOS-2 is necessary for interdisciplinary team evaluations. The clinician will also conduct and/or facilitate clinical research that supports the mission of the Division of Psychology, the mission of the IDD, and/or the mission of the Department of Pediatrics; provide instruction and supervision to predoctoral psychology interns who are participating in an APA accredited internship program, psychology practicum students, and postdoctoral fellows; and provide outreach/consultation to the community, patients of Doernbecher Children's Hospital, and OHSU staff and provider
