

2 GI Psychologist Positions at Boston Children's Hospital

The Division of Gastroenterology, in collaboration with the Department of Psychiatry at Boston Children's Hospital, is seeking **two** pediatric psychologists to expand their treatment team. The Division of Gastroenterology already employs two full-time psychologists in addition to seven clinical social workers.

Position 1: This full-time, primarily clinical position will involve working with patients diagnosed with chronic gastrointestinal illnesses, including Inflammatory Bowel Disease (IBD) (Crohn's Disease and Ulcerative Colitis), Avoidant Restrictive Food Intake Disorder (ARFID) and functional gastrointestinal disorders (chronic abdominal pain and Irritable Bowel Syndrome). The psychologist will provide outpatient consultation and therapy services within multidisciplinary GI programs, both on the Boston campus and in our outreach clinics within the greater Boston metropolitan area. Research opportunities are also available. Specific training and skills in treating pediatric depression, anxiety and chronic pain using cognitive behavioral therapy is preferred. Experience with treating disordered eating is highly desirable.

Position 2: This full-time position will entail providing outpatient consultation, evaluation, and therapy for children younger than 6 with malnutrition and feeding disorders in The Growth and Nutrition Program. The psychologist will conduct assessment and treatment within a multidisciplinary feeding program at Boston Children's Hospital at the main campus and in one or more satellite locations. The successful candidate will have expertise in behavioral therapy with young children and their families. Particular expertise in the field of feeding disorders in young children and/or adolescents would be an asset but enthusiasm and willingness to learn is most desirable. Training or clinical background in treating children with neurodevelopmental disorders is highly desired. Psychologists with doctoral level board certification in applied behavioral analysis (BCBA-D) or similar training are encouraged to apply.

Applicants for both positions must possess a Massachusetts health service provider license in psychology prior to assuming the position. Academic appointments at Harvard Medical School will likely be at the Instructor or Assistant Professor level. Graduates of APA/CPA-approved doctoral programs and internships are required.
